BUDGET HOTEL ROOMS FROM JAPANiCAN Tokyo JPY 7,000; Kyoto JPY 5,000; Osaka JPY 3,500

TOKYO, JAPAN – JTB Group company JAPANiCAN Inc. has released a list of budget hotels designed to provide travelers with all the basics while saving a bit of cash on accommodation. The “15 Hotels Under JPY 10,000” list introduces hotels in Tokyo, Kyoto, and Osaka that have single rooms available for less than JPY 10,000 (approximately US\$ 110) if booked by the end of March. Tokyo might have a reputation for being expensive but cheap hotels are available for those in the know. Local Japanese workers have long made use of the low-cost options near most major train stations called “business hotels.” Besides being convenient for company employees on business trips, these hotels are also great deals for tourists just looking for the basics. Business hotels in Tokyo can be had for as little as JPY 7,000 for a single room; Kyoto from JPY 5,000; and Osaka from JPY 3,500. Double-occupancy rates start at JPY 10,000 per room in Tokyo, JPY 5,000 in Kyoto, and JPY 5,800 in Osaka.

Full-service hotels with special rates are also highlighted in the JAPANiCAN feature, like the Akasaka Excel, a chic hotel in Tokyo’s lively Roppongi area with twin rooms for only JPY 17,000 – 44% off of the regular price. Even greater discounts are offered in Kyoto and Osaka. Double rooms at the ANA Hotel Kyoto, a perennial JAPANiCAN bestseller located directly next to Kyoto’s Nijo Castle, have been slashed by 61% to JPY 10,800. Twin rooms at Osaka’s Rihga Royal Hotel have similarly been cut by 61% to JPY 12,600.
